
I was not able to find a volunteer to head the Rabbi Search Committee. If you are interested, or know someone who is – no experience is needed – please let me know.



Mourning the Loss of a Language (with Tears of Laughter)

Many Jewish people around the world share the legacy of Yiddish, the language of their grandparents and great-grandparents and the "greats" before that. They lament the loss of a colorful language whose nuances, they claim, cannot be replicated in the lingua franca. Though I cannot count myself among the fluent, I have admired their love for the language and their hope that it will be revived.

Yiddish has all the attributes of a language: a literature, a culture, and at one time a geographical center; however, dispersion, assimilation, and the horrific tragedy of World War II have taken their toll. Yiddish is in the twilight of its life.

A relative of high German with hints of Slavic and Eastern European languages, Yiddish probably originated in the 10th century in Germany. The earliest written record is from the 12th century; and by the 14th century, Yiddish was the vernacular of Jews in Central Europe.

By World War II, there were about 17 million Jews worldwide. About twelve million spoke Yiddish. World War II took the lives of over 6 million.

Languages are ever-changing. They are born and they die, but rarely is one killed.

"Yiddish will survive in English," I often say, reciting a handful of the fifty or so Yiddish words which live comfortably in the English language. Many English speakers know *shmo, kibbitz, <u>chotchke</u>*, chutzpah. They also know the word glitch though few realize that it is a Yiddish word. I read a novel once where a character was sure that "conniption fit" was Yiddish. It's not, but it should be.

Years ago Yiddish was taught in a small number of private schools, but other subjects competed for the time slot and won. Prior to WWII senior adult classes were common in Jewish Community Centers where participants learned some phrases and words, but mainly told stories and laughed a lot.

At one time Yiddish humor is very much in vogue. It's not the Yiddish words (actually there are very few); rather, it's the expression, the accent, and the characterization of our friends and relatives, all of which make us laugh.

Me, I never used Yiddish words unless I was specifically recalling a Yiddish word. Growing up, I heard the language occasionally, and rarely at home. My maternal grandparents were not born in the "old country," but

rather in Chicago where they went to school and university and raised their children. My paternal grandfather came to the U.S. as a young man, but my paternal grandmother's family moved to St. Joe, Missouri when she was just two. As a child, I noted that she was the only one of her friends who spoke English without the "accent."

My sister Debby, however, married into a family where Yiddish words occasionally peppered the household conversation. Her husband, Mark, knows a lot more Yiddish than we do. Some years ago, I met with Debby and her daughter Amanda to plan her wedding in Orlando. As we discussed the options offered by the hotel, Debby asked, "What's that Yiddish word which means "all that other stuff'?" I shook my head; Amanda laughed; Debby texted Mark.

Her phone beeped within seconds. A message from Mark: "How do you say, "I don't know!" in Yiddish?



Yes, this "happy guy" is our own, Rabbi Herzfeld as he left for his vacation!

He sent this to me as he was waiting to board his flight for Frankfurt and then on to Tel Aviv.

He wished us well. I know he will have wonderful stories to tell us of his trip.


