A Message from Rabbi H.



The month of Elul, which precedes Tishri and Rosh Hashanah, has no formal Jewish holiday. Yet, it is considered the period to prepare for the High Holidays. I don't mean baking honey cakes or considering a menu for the Yom Tov meal. I don't mean buying a new dress or suit. It is the time we as Jews are supposed to prepare ourselves spiritually for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur - for the process of teshuva.

I often wonder if we take this opportunity seriously and actually consider our actions over the past year. You probably are familiar with the term, Selichot. We particularly concentrate on seeking forgiveness (Selichot) during the Saturday evening prior to Rosh Hashanah. However, traditional Jews include extra prayers for Selichot and pslams during the entire month of Elul at worship services.

My teacher, Rabbi Dr. Donniel Hartman, comments about the entire process of teshuva that we must take to heart each year. In ancient times, the prophets spoke to the people about teshuva, but they only knew "kapparah," which means sacrifice. In biblical times, the only way Israelites connected with God was through offerings/sacrifices. Our practice of prayer worship only began after the destruction of the second Temple and the end of the sacrificial cult.

According to Rabbi Hartman, in order to truly change (teshuva), we must feel bad in some way about who we are. More important, we have to know "who we want to be" in order to be to be motivated to change.

So, the month of Elul, offers us the opportunity to consider "who we want to be" each year. This is why Rosh Hashanah comes before Yom Kippur, states Rabbi Hartman. Teshuva doesn't just start with consideration of the past. It starts with the future. We have to be able to imagine who we want to be before we can do real teshuva.

WHO DO YOU WANT TO BE, ESPECIALLY IN THE YEAR AHEAD?

My warm wishes are extended to you and your loved ones for a Shanah Tova U'Metuka - a Sweet and Good New Year 5784.






The Book Club will meet at 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 12th.
