We danced and ate homemade hamantaschen!














Rabbi Herzfeld always gets the Purim celebration started.

THE SOLDIER'S PRAYER BOOK, OR THE DECK OF CARDS.

During the 1967 war in Israel, a bunch of soldiers had been on a long hike when they arrived at the wailing wall in Jerusalem. The next day being Shabbat, several of them went to the nearest synagogue. Those who had prayer books with them took them out. One soldier had a deck of cards, so he spread them out.

After the services were over, the Rabbi came over to the soldier and said: "What have you to say for yourself for this transgression in Shul?" "Very much, Rabbi;" said the young soldier. "I have been on the march for ten days, during which time I had neither bible nor prayer book. I hope to satisfy you, Rabbi that this was not transgression nor sin". With that he started his explanation:

"You see Rabbi, when I see the Ace, it reminds me that there is but one God.

When I see the Deuce, it reminds me of the Two Tablets of the Law.

When I see the Three, it reminds me of the three Patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

When I see the Four, it reminds me of the four Matriarchs, Sarah, Rebecca, Leah and Rachel.

When I see the Five, it reminds me of the Five Books of Moses.

When I see the Six, it reminds me that God made Heaven and Earth in six days.

When I see the Seven, it reminds me that on the Seventh Day God rested.

When I see the Eight, Rabbi, it reminds me of Abraham's covenant with G-d.

The Nine symbolizes the nine months it takes to bring life into the world.

When I see the Ten, it reminds me of the Ten Commandments that God gave Moses on Mount Sinai, on two tables of stone."

When I see the Jack, it reminds me of Joseph of old and his coat of many colors.

When I see the Queen, it reminds me of Queen Esther who with her Uncle Mordechai saved the Jewish people from destruction.

When I see the King, it reminds me that G-d, King of the Universe, is Supreme overall.

When I count how many spots there are in a Deck of Cards, I find there are three hundred and sixty-five, and there are so many days in the year."

There are 52 cards, the number of weeks in a year.


There are 4 suits, the number of weeks in a month.

There are 12 picture cards, the number of months in a year.

There are 13 tricks in a deck, the number of weeks in a quarter year.

"So you see, Rabbi, my Deck of Cards serves me as a Bible, a prayer book and an almanac".

The Rabbi was so moved by the soldier's explanation, that he blessed him with a benediction: May the Lord bless thee and keep thee. May the Lord let his Countenance shine upon thee and be gracious unto thee. May the Lord lift up his countenance upon thee and give thee peace.

Also in the spring, we have spring cleaning. Get your dustpan and feather out.


