Do Jews Celebrate Secular Holidays?



Yes, Jews have always observed civic and secular holidays. Some synagogues have a national flag on display and many synagogues participate in interfaith observances of holidays such as Thanksgiving and Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

<u>Mishkan T'filah</u>, the prayerbook of the Reform Movement, contains the national hymns of Israel, Canada, and the United States.

Many interfaith families celebrate Hanukah and Christmas. This past year Chrismukkah occurred as Hanukah and Christmas occurred on the same evening. This rare occurrence will not happen again until 2035, due to an extra month added to keep the Jewish holidays aligned with the correct seasons of the 365-day Solar calendar.



We often get requests from those who are looking for homes for Judaica after a loved one downsizes or passes on. The museum mentioned below, may be a place where your Judaica can be sent. Please include the story behind the item when looking to re-home your loved one's precious items.

AS an example, in 1994 my father gifted the museum his bombing maps of Germany, used when he was a Bombardier in WWII.

The B'nai B'rith Holocaust and Related Materials Collection, organized and funded by a generous grant from the Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany, Inc. and the Rabbi Israel Miller Fund for Shoah Research, Documentation and Education, includes correspondence, books and periodicals, directories, and maps pertaining to B'nai B'rith in Europe, Asia, Africa and the United States in the years before and after the Holocaust.

Remembered for the Judaica exhibitions mounted at B'nai B'rith's former Washington, D.C. headquarters from the mid-1950s through the year 2001, the B'nai B'rith Klutznick National Jewish Museum transferred its extensive acquisitions, consisting of paintings, sculptures and liturgical objects in 2015 to the Skirball Museum, also located on HUC's campus, where these artworks are now part of its permanent collection.



Shalom Aleichem!


Can you believe that we have marked a quarter century? We started with the fear of Y2K and ended with the fear of Covid.




