### **Temple Maintenance Project Fund**

Dear Temple Members,

Our facility on Bradbury Road was completed in 2003. Since then we have not really invested in any real exterior maintenance which at this point should be considered a necessary goal.

I have received a quote of \$11,680 to perform the following:

Pressure clean the building

Repair and caulk exterior cracks

Caulk all windows and doors

Seal exterior to receive paint

Paint two coats on exterior including walls, fascia, soffits, gutters and downspouts

Paint vinyl siding on gables and roof vinyl with vinyl friendly paint

Sand and re-stain 2 front doors

Paint rear and side door

Paint portico ceiling

Use Sherwin Williams Superpaint, sealer and vinyl paint

Donations to this project would be appreciated.

Alternative quotes and modifications to the above can be made, but the general goal is \$11,680.

# **The Secure Community Network**

On September 11, 2025 the Secure Community Network made available to us a presentation on a strategy to increase our synagogue's safety in these turbulent times: *Navigating Conflict: the Power of De-Escalation*. It was an informative discussion on how we all can increase our safety in using our listening skills to keep ourselves and others calm to reduce the risk in an escalating situation. There was important information on identifying what situations can be de-escalated and what situations cannot. De-escalation is called for if we have one or more people with us that are emotionally upset and need help to calm down. In these situations there is no immediate plan to cause harm, only to vent anger or distress. De-escalation is not helpful if someone comes to us with a plan to disrupt our services or harm people inside our sanctuary. Since the attack on the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh and October 7 in Israel, anti-semitic violence seems to be increasing; as are attacks on houses of worship in general recently. Many of us in the last several years are more concerned about this second kind of security risk. We cannot talk our way out of these. What can we do? There are multiple strategies Temple Beth Shalom is implementing:

- One of the first and most practical measures was an electronic entry system. This is why
  you use a key fob to get into the building. Recent history showed that assailants like
  easy targets and if they cannot get in the building they are not going to keep trying for
  long. This is a good time to remind you not to prop the door open or let someone you
  don't know follow you into the building. We can screen visitors to the temple and help
  keep each other safe.
- Temple Beth Shalom has security team volunteers that have completed active shooter or other security training through the Sheriff's Department, a private contractor, or in consultation with the US Marshals' office and are prepared to provide security leadership. They are trained at monitoring the entrances and keeping an eye on the congregation during services.
- The Polk County Sheriff's Department has shown a lot of interest in our safety and posted cameras to monitor the outside of our building. They reached out to us many times in the last several years and provided us with a contact at their offices. This past year they began posting a deputy outside any time we tell them our building will be occupied. The PCSD is doing a lot to show that the safety of our synagogue and its participants are important to them.

 We are applying for grants to support extensive security upgrades to the temple building such as stronger doors and greater ease of emergency exits, a better monitoring system, more cameras. We hope we can get these projects going this year.

Some of the best security strategies are in preparation and mindfulness, and your Board and congregation have these in great supply for you.

# **Maj Jong Ladies**




The Mah Jong ladies meet every Tuesday at noon.
